  - From in-hive products
- Symptoms include:

- Dead or dying bees near hive or on plants
- Spinning, twitching, disoriented bees
- Regurgitation with an extended tongue
- Abnormal behavior
- Immediately report suspected pesticiderelated incidents in Texas 512-463-7622
- EPA uses reports to identify patterns of bee kills, to inform pesticide regulatory decisions.
